



The National Cancer Registration Service is pleased to announce the launch of **CANCERSTATS** - the new reporting site for COSD.

The new **CANCERSTATS** information and reporting portal will be the repository for all feedback on datasets which are managed or supported by the National Cancer Registration Service (NCRS).

At the time of launch, you will have access to the new version of the **COSD Conformance Portal** containing Level 1-3 reports on data submissions for COSD.

Also available on the portal is **CASCADE** - the Cancer Information Tool which provides information on incidence, survival and mortality for cancer.

Over the coming months, users of the portal will have access to new reports on the National Lung Cancer Audit (NLCA), the National Prostate Cancer Audit (NPCA), the Systemic Anti-Cancer Therapy Dataset (SACT) and the Radiotherapy Dataset (RTDS) as well as a wealth of supporting documentation and material to support data collection in NHS trusts.

It will also support feedback to clinical teams with the new **Clinical Headline Indicator** metrics launching later in the year for all tumour sites.

Create reports not only at trust level, but also grouped by Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) based on the postcode of residence of patients.

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
